WEEKLY	Reading (At least three times a week).	Spellings (Practise your spellings for your test). Complete the weekly home learning tasks set by Miss Moseley.
TERMLY	<p><u>Crack the code!</u> The Vikings had their own way of writing called runes. Write your own message in runes about something connected with life in Viking times. We will see if the rest of the class can translate the message! To make the message look old, you could dip the paper in tea that has cooled down (please ask an adult to help you make the tea), let the paper dry and then write the message.</p>	<p><u>Human digestion</u> We are learning about humans and living things in science. Your task is to make a 2D or 3D model of the human digestion system. You can use any materials you like. Remember to label each part of the digestion process using the correct scientific vocabulary.</p>
	<p><u>Viking art</u> Select a famous figure from the Viking era. Draw, paint or make a collage of them. It could be a king, soldier, God or someone else. Underneath your picture, explain who is in the picture/collage and why they were famous.</p>	<p><u>Viking houses</u> Build a model of a Viking home. Think about the features of the home and write how it is different to our homes now. There are many ideas online to inspire you!</p>

Plan out what you want to do before you start, chat through your ideas with someone else if you want to **but the end result must be your own work**. Take your time, redraft if you need to. Produce your best work and have fun!
